1. History and Background to establishing Dalton Together

Former Ward Councillors, Peter McBride, Naheed Mather and current Ward Councillor Musarrat Khan alongside their Active Citizens and Places Officer - Cheryl Reid (Democracy Service/Place Based Working Team), had for several years been hosting and facilitating Ward Partnership Meetings as part of their commitment to promoting effective ward partnership working and regularly championed their vision for improved place based working in order to **develop a whole ward partnership approach... Being Ward Wise** (was then, a working title) to:

- **Strengthening partnership working** and putting in place an organisation with appropriate governance arrangements
- **Providing generous leadership across the ward** to enable Councillors, the community, and partners to champion shared goals
- **Responding to shared community priorities** and needs through effective partnership working arrangements
- **Increasing the effectiveness, support and sustainability of community groups** across the ward (existing and newly emerging ones - of all sizes)
- **Sustaining current provision** and developing essential community activities/services across the ward
- **Developing new activities and services** by building on the strengths and assets that exist across the ward
- **Undertaking volunteer succession planning** - by supporting existing volunteers and growing new generations of younger volunteers across the ward by putting in place a Volunteering Brochure and relevant volunteering event(s) bespoke to the area
- **Developing strategic communication, community engagement and attracting investment into the ward** – to meet the diverse needs of the community

Working alongside residents, local community groups, partner organisations, Cummins, Syngenta and Third Sector Leaders... Dalton Together was formally established at a partnership meeting on 2nd September 2019 after it went through an in-depth **visioning exercise called the Message Triangle** (facilitated by Cummins representatives) which created its own:

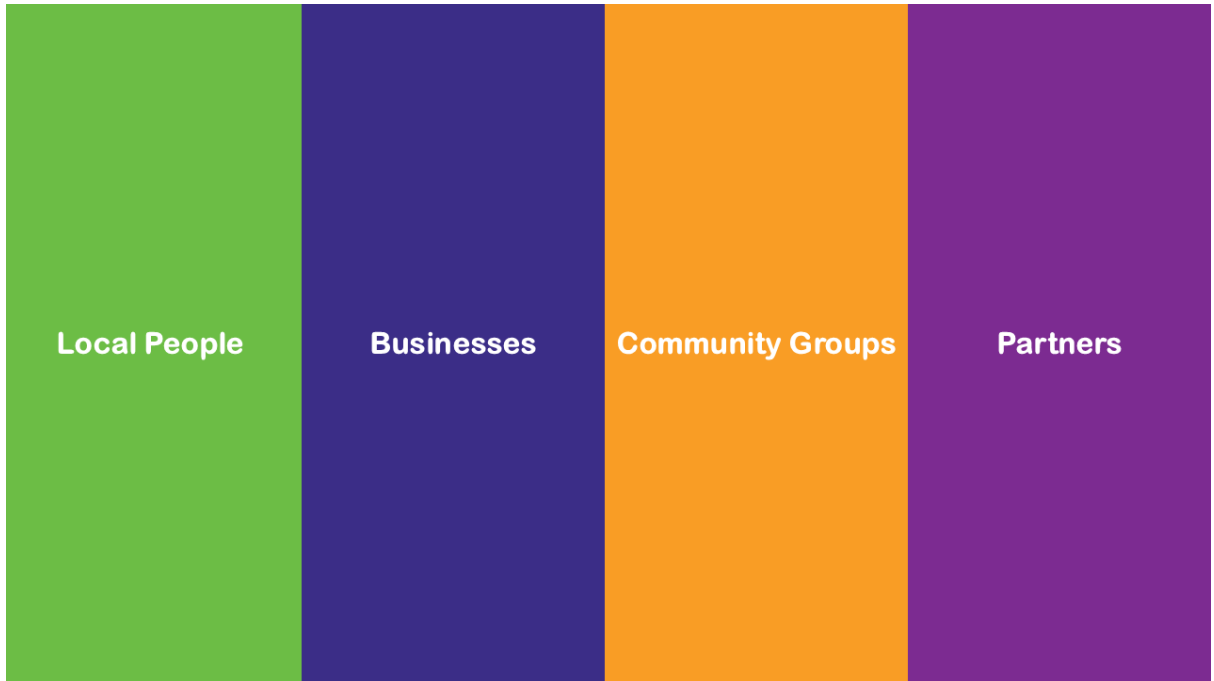

4. Chair's Report – Acting – Cheryl Reid on behalf of the Executive Board:

I want to start by acknowledging that any successes attributed to Dalton Together are the result of a collective team effort. The executive team, current Ward Councillors, partner organisations, local groups, services, and the community all work tirelessly to make positive things happen. Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, austerity, and cuts to services and support, our enthusiasm remains undiminished. Our collaborative approach, projects and initiatives continue to meet and support the diverse needs of the people living in the Dalton Ward. The project will aim to provide immediate crisis support, promote financial independence, and create opportunities for learning, volunteering, and employment. By fostering strong relationships and sharing knowledge between Dalton and Deighton, the project will help build community capacity to address local challenges. This new initiative focuses on individuals and families experiencing poverty and disadvantage, ensuring they receive the necessary, timely support to improve their well-being and financial security.

We are hoping LS2Y, with its extensive knowledge and experience, will play a crucial role in helping to develop Dalton Together and its Executive. LS2Y and third sector colleagues will review and strengthen our governance structures and guide the executive to become more

robust, enabling the organisation to transition into a CIO/CIC. This transformation will aim to attract further investment to the Dalton Ward, strengthen asset protection, and enhance the delivery of key projects and contracts to benefit the residents of the Dalton Ward. We know our area best!

We are a growing umbrella partnership organisation, and our future success hinges on attracting individuals with the right skills and knowledge to support and advance our organisation and its executive. We know it works, but we need everyone's help to strengthen it— Ward Councillors, community groups, residents, local businesses, services and our partners. By working together, we can ensure sustainability for the future. We recognise this is a significant challenge, so please join us on this journey because... 'Together we can make good things happen.'

ICAFS

The cost-of-living crisis is having a profound effect on children, families, carers, and the elderly, with many households struggling to afford basic needs. At ICAFS, their advisers are seeing a sharp rise in food insecurity, debt, and mental health issues, making day-to-day life incredibly challenging for many.

ICAFS Support

Their specialised debt and welfare services are helping families navigate these difficult times. From welfare benefits to debt relief, they're working tirelessly to stabilise households, reduce financial strain, and improve wellbeing.

By The Numbers (May 2024 – Sept 2024)

- **117 individuals** supported, with **489 individual problems** tackled through appointments, phone and home visits.
- **21 individuals** prevented from being bankrupt. **23** Magistrates & County Court Actions prevented.
- **33 adults and 19 children** received dedicated support for Disability Benefits.
- **79 individuals/families** were "fully stabilized" and no longer dependent on food parcels, with **£109,819.60** in debt written off. Between (Oct 2023 – Apr 2024) **43 households** were stabilized and no longer dependent on food parcels, with **36 individuals becoming debt-free**, with **£178,558** in debt written off.
- **£511,262.00** generated in income through missing benefits and support schemes for families in need. Between (Oct 2023 – Apr 2024) **£623,086.80** was generated in income.

- *Our focus* - We want to help build and nurture the ‘roots’ so people will flourish. We intend to take people from a time of crisis or close to crisis (e.g. accessing emergency food banks, being in debt, using loan sharks etc) and support them to improve their finances (management of debts and income maximisation), start to save, and access affordable food and advice on healthy and affordable cooking.



Volunteers are at the heart of our community. All our partners work with volunteers and a key aim of the organisation is to increase volunteering across the ward. Volunteering is integral to our vision to **help people find rewarding ways to give time**. We have 3 key overarching objectives:

- To develop new volunteering opportunities by working closely with our partners
- To encourage more diverse volunteering opportunities E.g. volunteers from our local businesses

6. Going Forward – we will have an increased focus on tackling food and money insecurities:



- **BRASS** – Working alongside Cheryl Reid from the Democracy Service/Place Based Working Team - Dalton Together will support the re-established BRASS meeting (a sub-group off the main Dalton Ward Partnership Meeting) and the refresh of the Dalton Wards financial wellbeing BRASS partnership action plan which aims:
 1. **To co-ordinate, promote, develop and deliver grass root initiatives** to support residents (of all ages) across the Dalton Ward, by bringing partners to together to better understand what the issues are locally and what work is being done to help the financially excluded.
 2. **To improve the skills and understanding of those who come into contact with those in financial need**, with the recognition that prevention is better than cure.
 3. **To support those in immediate crisis, promote financial independence and create opportunities for learning, volunteering, and employment.** We will focus on individuals and families experiencing poverty and disadvantage, ensuring they receive the necessary, timely support to improve their well-being and financial security.
- **Through BRASS we will work with people to maximise what money people do have**, earning the most they can, spending and borrowing in the most efficient ways and reduce the impacts of unforeseen changes to financial circumstances when combined will help to improve the financial wellbeing of our local residents.
- **BRASS (as a brand/framework) will bring together partnership activities** around; budgeting, saving, avoiding arrears and safe borrowing, spending money efficiently, keeping money safe from scams and fraud. The Framework is applicable to a very wide range of financial circumstances and is designed to offer hints, tips, information, resources and advice about applying each of the elements of the **BRASS framework** in a logical and practical way. **BRASS stands for = B - budget, R - rainy day, A - avoid arrears, S - spend, S – security**
- **Through BRASS we will also ensure we aim to promote 'sharing is caring' by:**
 - i. **Tackling hunger and food waste** by continuing to redistribute surplus food across the Dalton Ward and establish more donation points
 - ii. **Supporting community food sharing projects** and growing and cooking of fruit and vegetables and to encourage local residents' involvement

- iii. **Increasing the availability and consumption of affordable fresh fruit and vegetables** in the Dalton Ward as part of a healthier diet

➤ **Impacts from our approach will impact on our residents:**

1. Pockets - maximising the financial resources of families and individuals on low incomes *(There are currently more families/individuals in poverty who are working than not working. In-work poverty is rising, and it's being driven by low pay, unstable contracts and rises in the cost of living)*

2. Prospects - improved life chances of children and families in poverty *(The attainment gap in schools means poorer children often do less well at school than their more affluent peers. This 'gap' widens as children go through school, with fewer poorer children heading off to 'positive destinations' and ultimately to better paid work)*

3. Places - build strong local networks, enable communities to set their own priorities and support them to build their capacity *(Influence should be shared with communities and resources devolved to support them to respond to what's needed in their neighbourhoods)*

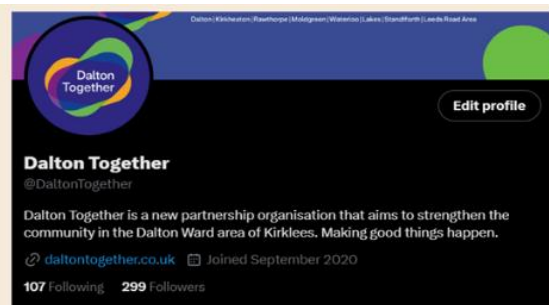

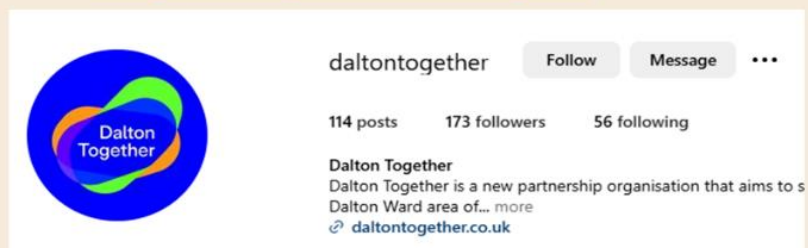
